LORD ROSEBERRY'S SPLENDID APPEAL

GREAT GATHERING HEARS NOTED SPEAKER URGING MEN TO ENLIST

Edinburgh, Scotland—Lord Rosebery recently addressed a great gathering at Brixburn called together with the object of giving an impetus to recruiting. They would not know for years to come, he said, the secret history of what brought about the war. It was really a spark in the midst of the great powder magazine, which the nations of Europe have been building up for the last 20 or 30 years, a spark alighting in that tremendous powder magazine which, with infinite toil, misapplied toil, the nations of Europe had been constructing.

"When you go on building up armaments against each other," he continued, "there comes a time when neither the guns go off of themselves, or else the people say, 'We can no longer bear this burden of suspense; we had better make an end of it and come to blows at once.'"

Parties to a Treaty
"We were parties," Lord Rosebery continued, "to a treaty to which France

and the kingdom of Prussia were also parties, guaranteeing the independence and the integrity of Belgium. We determined, rightly or wrongly, wisely or unwisely, but I think rightly and wisely, that so long as any power remained in the arm of Great Britain she was bound not to go back upon her pledged word to Belgium, and she was determined that if Germany were resolved to violate her word, Great Britain would not violate hers.

"I want now to say a word as to how this crisis comes home to ourselves. This is the greatest war that the world has ever seen, beyond all comparison the greatest war the world has ever seen. The battle of Leipzig, in which Russia, Austria and Prussia fought against the Emperor Napoleon and crushed him, was called the Battle of the Nations. But it was not the battle of the nations; it was the battle of great armies.

"It was reserved for this war to be the battle of the nations. It is a war of nations, and our nation, if it is to uphold itself, will not be able to remain aloof. We are fighting on the continent it is true, but we are fighting in defense of Great Britain. There is one thing that is perfectly clear in all this matter, it is that those who go to fight will go to fight in a righteous cause.

"We are fighting for the independence

of Belgium against a power which guaranteed it, and has destroyed it. We are fighting for the freedom of France, a friendly power, who is allied with ourselves. But we are also fighting for the sanctity of the public law of Europe, which, if our enemies shall be the conquerors, is torn up and destroyed for ever.

German Minister Quoted

"When a German minister was asked if he were really going to infringe the neutrality of Belgium, he said, 'You are not going to war for that, going to war for a scrap of paper.'"

"A great power that treats 'scrap of paper' like that is not unlikely to be scrapped himself. The German chancellor, when he vindicated this policy in Parliament, said, 'We knew we were doing wrong in invading the neutrality of Belgium, but we were compelled to do wrong.' A nation that begins a great war by declaring that its foundation is wrong, and that it is obliged to do wrong, is likely to fare badly if there be a God in Heaven.

"I know," Lord Rosebery went on, "that we have seen wars in our time in which the loss of a province or two ended the war. That will not be so. We have seen wars in which an indemnity of money put an end to the war. That will not be so. You may lose territory and you may lose money, but what is certain

is that, that if you are beaten to your knees, if you are compelled to submit, you will lose infinitely more than province or money.

Urged to Step Into Breach

"Make no mistake, this is a fight to a finish. If we go under now we go under forever. I do not ask you to say to yourselves that 'you' will go under for a moment. But if you are not going under, every man who is capable of defending his country is bound to step into the breach. Make no mistake about it, we shall win. We are fighting with our back to the wall to prevent a shame and defeat such as England has never sustained and is not now prepared to endure.

"We are going to win because a nation and an empire like ours cannot be extinguished by any such warfare as this. We are going to win because we have our people united as they never have been before. We are going to win because your dominions and empires outside these islands vie with each other in generous emulation as to which shall give us most support in supplies and money and men.

"Above all, we are going to win because we have a high, a pure, and a just cause, and we can appeal with humble but, I think, earnest confidence to Him who in the words of our beautiful old paraphrase we recognize as the

"God of Bethel by Whose hand Our people still are led."

for many months past and there are three beds in a number of rooms and four in some.

Eighteen More Bed Rooms

The new home now close to completion will provide eighteen new bedrooms, each to be furnished with a single bed. The rooms with their painted walls and hard wood floors, looks notably attractive. Each room is fitted with two fixtures for lights at either end of the apartment and the windows have a wide high sash at the bottom, with a smaller pane of glass at the top. The rooms are painted a light tan or cream shade and the doors are cherry stained. There is a roomy closet with each room. The hall has a tan colored top with a light green bottom and a line of darker green running between these colors. Clusters of three lights are installed at each end of the hall, though the wiring has not yet been completed.

Bathrooms Are Welcomed

The addition is of two floors furnishing nine bedrooms each in addition to which the bath rooms will provide facilities that have never been given in the

old quarters. There are two tubs in each one, stationary sinks and lavatories, beside set off sinks and plumbing where the maids may attend to their work. At the south end of the building or the rear part is a verandah that has already aroused keen desire and like Joseph's garments will be allotted to many.

The verandah allows a beautiful view of the country, albeit there are some obstructions that are not entirely entrancing but it is not the views the white capped maidens are ravished about. It is going to be a sleeping space and another year as many beds as the two verandahs will contain will be placed upon them. On the east side of the old building in the front, a beautiful wide verandah has been one of the additions and this has already been used by outdoor sleepers.

Fine Lecture Rooms

In addition to the bedrooms space in new home, there is a basement that contains a lecture room and a demonstration room. It was hoped to have these finished first and ready for the series of lectures now beginning but it appears they will be finished last. The lecture room which is on the right of the hall will seat thirty and the demonstration room has sink and marble table and will be installed with sanitary devices so that work may be performed correctly and neophytes shown how to do some of the simple nursing tasks. Hitherto there

has been no facility for this and the construction had to be given in the ward. Beyond these two large rooms are two smaller ones which may be given to the lecturers for their materials and for their outer garments as they lay them aside. Both of these large rooms have sliding doors, shutting them off from the corridor, or with them open, one large apartment may be obtained.

There are four bedrooms in this portion of the new building and these will be used by the employees of the Home. There is a bath and other sanitary accommodations and the windows here are of ground glass. Ground glass is installed in all bathroom windows and the floors are covered with cork linoleum.

The storm windows are an appreciated feature as they open like shutters, inward and outward from the inner window. Thus they may be opened an inch, a foot or to their entire frame length, with a sliding iron bar that works without friction.
