EUROPE CHILLED.

THE MERCURY PLAYING HIDE AND GO-SEEK WITH THE ZERO MARK.

London, January 4.—A blizzard prevails in England to-day. There is a beavy snowfall in the southern counties.

Newcastle, January 2nd, 1894. A severe gale is blowing in the channel. The weather in Austria and Hungary is bitterly cold. In Vienna last night the mercury registered ninteen degrees be-low the freezing point. The suffering among the poor is terrible. The Danube is frozen over from Vienna to Belgrade, Servia.
