




This will be a busy year for King George V.

Indeed, so vast a programme has been arranged for him that he will easily beat the record as the world's champion hustler.

Even at present the King is, of course, extremely busy, but the most arduous programme of great State functions, which will mark Coronation year, does not open until one year and a day after the death of his late Majesty King Edward VII.

On May 6th, the anniversary of King Edward's death, the Royal family and a large assemblage of Royal relatives will meet at St. George's Chapel, Windsor, for a solemn memorial service. Then, honor to the great dead having been duly done, the curtains will roll back next day upon a season of paceantry unsurpassed in this country's history.

The first of their Majestles' Courts will be held on May 7th. Between that date and June 22nd there will be four such opportunities for some thousands of the noblest and most distinguished men and women in the land to make their bow before the King and Queen Mary.

To the first Court, on May 7th, between 860 and 1,000 will be invited. Shortly before 10 p.m. on that occasion, carriages and electric broughams will crowd the route to Buckinsham Palame.
