THE BAPTIST FORWARD MOVEMENT

Like most of the other similar movements, the Baptist Forward Movement has two principal objects, the spiritual and the financial. As a matter of fact, however, this distinction of objects is solely for convenience of organization, since the whole movement in its beginnings, its progress, and its aims is spiritual. The Baptists of Canada are persuaded that for them any success that might be gained that should not be spiritual, would be failure.

The Baptist Forward Movement is the answer of faith to the call of the hour; it is recognition of the supreme opportunity created by the present world situation; it frankly recognizes the terrible dangers in the collapse of the old order of things, in the rampant and defiant materialism of the day, and in the sweeping away of the old moral standards; but it is the expression of the confident belief that the Church of God holds the solution of every world problem, and that the Baptists have a real contribution to make to the establishment of a new order of things; it is the consecration of a people to the continuation and completion of the sacrifice made by our soldiers in France and Flanders.

Six great spiritual aims have been set before the churches: (1) Personal consecration, with the call for a fresh and more complete surrender to Christ; (2) Prevailing Prayer, with stimulus to individual, family and public prayer in answer to which the local Baptist women are holding many cottage meetings each week; (3) Christian instruction, seeking more general practice of Bible reading and study, together with an intolerance in general religious and denominational matters; (4) Personal Service, enlisting every member, so far as possible, in some form of Christian service, and especially seeking recruits for the ministry and for missionary service; (5) Intelligent Evangelism, using every wise means, both personal and public, to win others to faith in Christ, and especially stressing the aim that each Baptist will seek a commission from God to become His messenger of salvation to

some one soul; (6) Sacrificial Giving.

The financial objective in which the local Baptists will co-operate was set by the Convention of Ontario and Quebec. It should be remembered that there is no national Baptist organization; instead, there are three conventions, the Maritime, the Western and that of Ontario and Quebec, and as many Forward Movements. The Convention of Ontario and Quebec determined last October to raise \$300,000 in the next two years, for the following objects:—
Foreign Missions, \$110,000.
Home Missions, \$60,000.
McMaster University, \$60,000.
Grande-Ligne (French) Mission, \$40,000.
Western Missions, \$10,000.
Sunday Schools, \$10,000.
Ministerial Superannuation, \$10,000.

Later it was decided that all money raised above that amount and up to \$30,000 additional, should go to Ministerial Superannuation. While the amount suggested seems at first glance to be small, it takes a good place among the financial objectives of the various Forward Movements when estimated on the member-per-year basis.

From all quarters comes evidence that the financial objective will be reached. From Toronto churches has gone forth the challenge that the rest of the Baptists raise the \$300,000, and that they will then raise dollar for dollar.

Queen Street Baptist Church in this city is organized and in line with all this great undertaking, and will doubtless do its part fully.

The O.M.A. Executive Committee dealt with many important matters at a protracted meeting last night. Some second round games were arranged, but no announcements of the dates will be made for a day or two.
