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Sir Moses Montefiore.

The name Montefiore, borne by the illustrious Hebrew philanthropist who has just entered his one-hundredth year, is derived, says The Jewish Chronicle, from a small town on the eastern slope of the Apennines, formerly part of the Papal Marbles. Sumames derived from towns are not at all uncommon either among Italian or German Jews.

The grandfather of Sir Moses settled in England as a merchant, trading with Italy. He lived and died in Phipost Lane, but he had a country retreat in the then rural solitude of Bethnal Green. One of his sons, Joseph Elias Montefiore, who had married Rachel Mocatta, was an importer of Lehigh straw bonnets. His wife accompanied him on a commercial visit to Lehigh, and there Sir Moses, the oldest of nine children, was born.

Young Moses was apprenticed to a firm in the provision trade, but ultimately he went on the Stock Exchange. Although a member of the Sephardin, or Spanish, congregation, which at that time was a kind of Jewish aristocracy, he married a German Jewess, Judith, the daughter of Levy Barient Cohen, a wealthy merchant in the City. It was in memory of her that Sir Moses built the Jewish College at Ramsgate. The sister of Lady Montefiore married Mr. N. M. Rothschild, the founder of the English house of that name. It may interest those who are anxious to learn how to prolong the life that Sir Moses sustained, nature almost entirely upon milk, sometimes varied by a little soup and bread and butter; but he has the old English love of generous ports, of which he takes two or three glasses daily.
