Under the provisions of the War Measures Act, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to order:  
1. That no unmarried man between the ages of 20 and 35 years, who is eligible for the Army or Navy, shall be permitted to leave this Dominion.  
2. That no person whose ever shall be allowed to leave the Dominion without a Passport.  
For public information it is notified that persons holding Passports under dates prior to the 11th April, 1918, will, in the event of their desiring to leave Newfoundland, require to present the said Passports at this office, in order that they may be vised, as without such vise they will not be permitted to leave the Dominion.
