AN EVIL COMBINATION.

TEHERAN, Persia, July 19.
The Armenian Government, having refused to obey an ultimatum of the Russian Soviet Government, the Bolshevik army has received orders to advance and has already occupied the Province of Karabach. The Bolsheviks are continuing their advance in order to operate jointly with the Turkish Nationalist forces of Mustafa Kemal Pasha.

ON A BRITISH BASIS.

LONDON, July 19.
The reply of the Russian Soviet Government to the British note concerning an armistice, which Poland rejects, is, in substance, British peace proposals, according to the London Times, which to-day publishes a summary of the Soviet answer.

FIREMEN WATCHED BURNING.

DUBLIN, July 19.
A daring raid was carried out by armed men at the King's Bridge terminus of the Great Southern Railroad this afternoon. The raid resulted in the destruction of three railway cars, filled with military stores, which were being guarded by ten soldiers. The raiders armed with revolvers, drove in motor cars and surrounded and disarmed the soldiers, and afterwards set fire to cars containing military stores. A fire brigade was summoned, but the men refused to extinguish the flames when the circumstances of the fire were learned. Nevertheless the firemen kept the flames from spreading beyond the military stores.

SPONTANEOUS IGNITION.

LONDON, July 19.
A big explosion has occurred in the Sarre region of Germany, caused by aerial bombs, according to a wireless despatch from Berlin. The inhabitants of the vicinity are reported to be fleeing, as an explosion of gas shells is anticipated. A wireless despatch says "A result of spontaneous ignition of some rockets, which caused an explosion of a dozen aerial bombs, a tremendous explosion has occurred in a munition dump in the former German military park in Sarre region. Inhabitants of the neighbourhood are fleeing as an explosion of a large number of gas shells is expected. Two hundred railway carriages are being held in readiness, in order to evacuate threatened districts."

INTIMIDATING JURORS.

CORK, July 19.
Only twelve out of two hundred and ninety six jurors were present when the Court of Assizes opened to-day. All jurors had received notice not to attend, from the Sinn Fein Executive. It was necessary to postpone the Inquest into the death of Commissioner Smyth who was killed Saturday at the County Club.

SYRIAN MANDATE.

LONDON, July 20.
King Feisal has accepted the French mandate for Syria, subject to the League of Nations, according to a Daily Mail report from Cairo, dated Sunday.

SANDY HOOK, July 20.
Capt. Burton will be at the wheel of Shamrock IV. In to-day's race over a triangular course. The new handicap for the challenger is seven minutes and one second, on account of her larger club topsail. Weather to-day is moderate; mostly northwest winds and fine.

ST. CATHERINES, July 20.
Work was resumed yesterday on the Welland Canal, after a lay off for a year owing to labor troubles. It is expected to take about five years to complete the work.

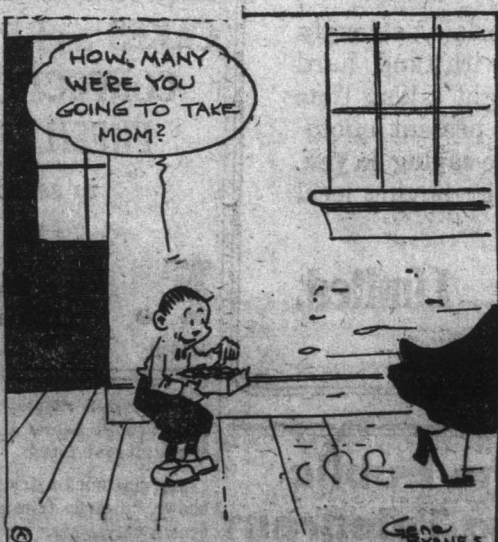

Radium \$3,000,000 Per Ounce.

Radium, the most wonderful of the metals and used chiefly as a cure for cancer, is produced at the rate of one ounce per year, which is valued at about \$3,000,000. The accumulated stores of the whole world amount to only four ounces. In actual practice the surgeon generally uses a minimum of fifty milligrams of the powerful substance, which quantity, of about the size of a match head, costs him \$600. Radium metal is shaped into a tiny rod no larger than a small piece of the lead of a pencil which is encased in a glass capsule and hermetically sealed, as any contact by the surgeon's fingers with the radium cause serious burns.
