

Last night our representative was afforded an opportunity to view the (new) Green Lantern ice-crcam parlours on Theatre Hill, which have just been completely re-decorated and en-larged. The building has been ex-tended towards the rear some twenty feet and in place of the two small rooms operated on the ground floor by the former owners, we were taken through two large, strikingly hand-some apartments, one situate above the other, each capable of seating
