



Ony Officials Complete Big Joh he job, now nearing completion, of ying at the junction of Rennie's Having at the junction of remines Hill and the old railway track, a sec-tion of the great northern sewen, is one of the most difficult work underone of the most difficult work under-taken by the City Engineering Depart-ment for some time. The sewor, which is taid along the track from Dwyer's Hill to Hoylestown, is built of brick, with an inside diameter of 18736 inches, but at the point men-13736 mcnes, but at the point men-tioned was contracted because the 16-inch water main laid in 1861, which crosses at right angles, was on a grade that left but little space for the swer to pass under. After every rainstorm for a number of years this mail section of sewer became choked, but until lately it could not be remedied without great fire risks. The job just completed involved taking up over 100 feet of the old main water pipe and relaying it at a depth two feet less than previously, thus cutting off a sewer from Rennie's Mill Road nd the putting in of the 18x36 section. Coupled with this job the department placed a new scower and sluice at the foot of Robinson's Hill. This was also a difficult job, as it was necessary to go three feet below the hed of Rennie's River, the water from which filling the cut prevented the ervce, and with it the work was acmplished. 
