**LONDON LAWYER TO PROSECUTE BLONDIEL**

Mr. Edmund Meredith, K. C., to Act for Crown in L'Original Murder Case.

At the trial of Albert Blondiel, which opens at the L'Original assizes Monday morning before Justice Britton, Mr. Edmund Meredith, K. C., of this city, will act as crown prosecutor. Blondiel is charged with the murder of Dr. Empey, of Vars, whom he shot and killed when the latter responded to a call from the Blondiel residence to attend a sick man. Mr. Meredith was crown prosecutor at the trial of James Gorham, of Peterboro, who was found guilty of shooting his mother while attempting to escape arrest.
