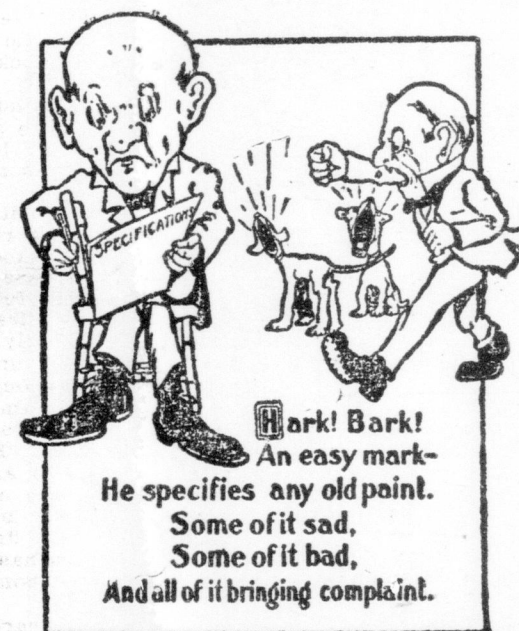

BOILER BURST KILLING ONE

Another Man Is So Badly Hurt That He May Not Recover.

LOSS WILL BE \$20,000

[Canadian Press.] Oshawa, Ont., Sept. 12.—The boiler at the gas works, recently purchased from the town of Oshawa by the Severn Gas Company, exploded this morning at 9:30. Thomas Buckley was instantly killed, and Daniel Anderson lies so seriously injured that a hospital he is not expected to recover. The only employee who was in the building just prior to the explosion had stepped outside an instant before, and escaped injury. A large number of windows in the neighborhood were broken, and the entire city got a bad shaking up. Two large gas tanks, one containing 60,000, the other 20,000 cubic feet, in close proximity to the exploded boiler, fortunately escaped damage, or the disaster would have been much more serious. The building is a total wreck, and the loss will probably reach \$20,000.

"SNAP" ALL CHINESE FOR CERTIFICATES

Will Enable Celestials To Be Identified When Leaving or Entering Canada.

All new certificates issued to Chinese immigrants will be adorned with photographs of the holders in order to make it easier for them to identify themselves when leaving or returning to Canada. Circulars, which are being sent out to immigration officials and others, urge the advantage of all Chinese in Canada exchanging the present certificates which they hold for new certificates, and provision is also made for the issuing of the new certificates or for some reason have not received the certificates they are entitled to. Students who have surrendered their certificates, which are made out in duplicate, each with a photograph of the holder and one of copy, which he retains, sending the other to Ottawa.

Not Compulsory. The order for the new pictorial certificates is not compulsory, but recognizing the advantage of the new style of certificates the Chinese in London and other cities are preparing to comply with the necessary "steps," including having "their pictures taken," in order to receive the new certificates. Mr. Lu-Ping Tien, Chinese consul at Ottawa, in conjunction with the immigration branch of the department of the interior, has arranged for the new issue of certificates.
