Arrangements of League of Nations.

LONDON, Dec. 28.—Premier Lloyd George, speaking at Llanstymdwy, Wales, today defended the voting arrangements of the league of nations. He said that Australia lost as many He said that Australia lost as many men as the United States in the war and had as much right to vote as the United States. This vote, however, he added, would not be used on any question arising between Great Britain and the United States.

"President Wilson recognized the justice and fairness of the claim put forward in behalf of the British Empire," said the premier. He recounted the fight in the United States on the treaty, which he termed "the folly of America entering upon party warfare when trying to settle the difficulties and troubles ensuing from the great war."

BOARD WILL PROBE PACKERS' MERGERS BRIGHTON

Will Be Deemed Against Public Interest Unless Full Dis-

closure Made.

TORONTO, Dec. 27.—The board of commerce in a statement dealing with combines indicates that it may, if it sees fit, hold inquiries into recent with American firms, such as were recently carried out by the Matthews-Blackwell Company and the Wm. Davies Company of this city. The board will early in January make a regulation to the effect that unless full disclosure is made to the board before any such mergers are consummated, so that the interest of the public may be protected, the board will deem such mergers or transfers against the public interest. If necessary the board may hold a public inquiry into the facts.

The same regulation will apply to any price-fixing arrangements. As to past transactions, but occurring since July 7, 1919, the date when the legislation establishing the board was passed, there will be a provision whereby the necessary information must be furnished to the board before March 1, 1920.
