## SAYS ADOLESCENT ACT MUST BE AMENDED

### U. A. Buchner Addresses Lord Roberts Club on Laws Pertaining to Children.

Mr. U. A. Buchner was the speaker at last night's meeting of the Lord Roberts Mothers' Club and gave an interesting talk on "The Laws Pertaining to Women and Children." He stated the U. F. O. government has enacted a larger number of laws pertaining to domestic relations than any other government during the past fourteen years.

In speaking of the adolescent act, he stated that this act would have to be amended, as it was not proving satisfactory. He explained that farm boys were the only ones exempt from its observance and that many children found it very difficult to attend school when their support was needed at home. Dr. Bryant told of a case of a child who was spending part time at school and was working until 11 o'clock each night, and as a result was neither doing his work nor studying properly.

The law of adoption was also spoken of, and Mr. Buchner explained that the courts now decided cases of adoption, and after a child had been legally adopted it took its foster parents' name and was entitled to inheritance the same as the parents' children.

A lively discussion on wills took place following the address. The speaker explained that a man can will everything away from his wife except one-third of his property. The mothers agreed that this law was very unjust.

During the business session, Mrs. W. J. Carson and Mrs. H. Dickinson were appointed as delegates to attend the home and school convention being held in Toronto during Easter week. An enjoyable program was given the numbers including solos by Mrs. Winifred Mack and Miss Donni Schram. Mrs. F. Bryant presided over the meeting.

## MRS. BISSET SPEAKS ON POLITICS OF INDIA

### Comments On Gandhi's "Co-operation" Policy — Club Votes \$25 to Scholarship.

Interesting comment on the recent despatch from London, stating that the British government had invited the famous Indian leader, Mohandas Gandhi, D. R. Das, and the extremist leader, Motilal Nehru, to a conference in London, and furthermore, that Gandhi was urging his followers to become co-operators, was made by Mrs. A. G. Bisset of Bangalore, Burma, at last night's meeting of the University Women's Club held at the Normal School.

"If Mr. Gandhi, as the despatch says, is urging his followers to become 'co-operators,' it is an entire reversal of his former policy, and is of great significance," declared Mrs. Bisset. "For some time past there has been a deadlock in the Indian house brought about by the Home Rulers or Swarajists," continued Mrs. Bisset. "And Monday's despatch is the intimation of a break in that deadlock."

"Until there is absolute unity between Hindu and Moslem in India home rule is an impossibility," said the speaker. "Mr. Gandhi has very high ideals. He believes that home rule in India can never be accomplished until the great body of 50,000,000 untouchables will be taken in. He stands for the removal of the social degradation of these outcasts. But his followers have been moving away from him during his sojourn in prison. And now we see him a man of saintly ideals, who has ventured into the sordid arena of politics, and finds sadly that his followers have not the same ideals as he has."

"The Home Rulers of India have entered into the Indian government for the express purpose to obstruct. And they wonder why his followers have not the same ideals as he has."

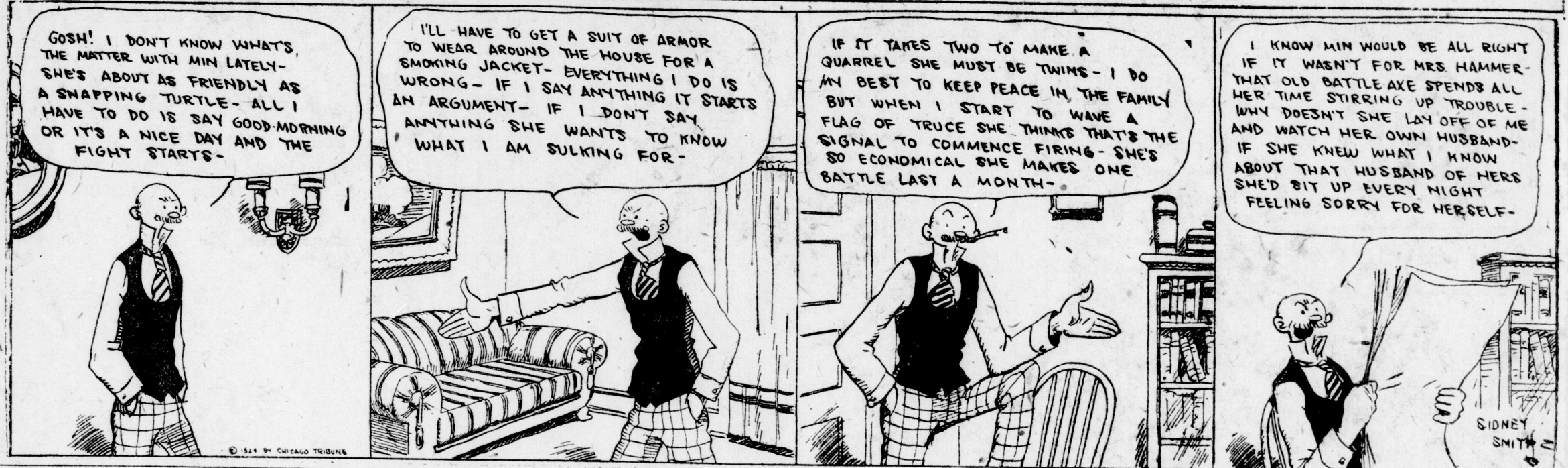

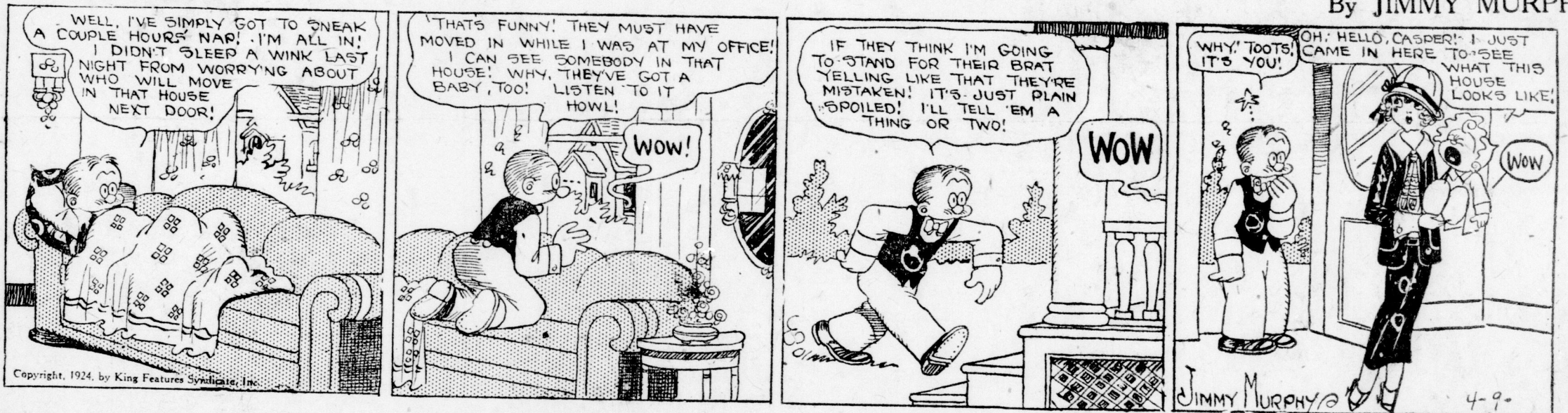

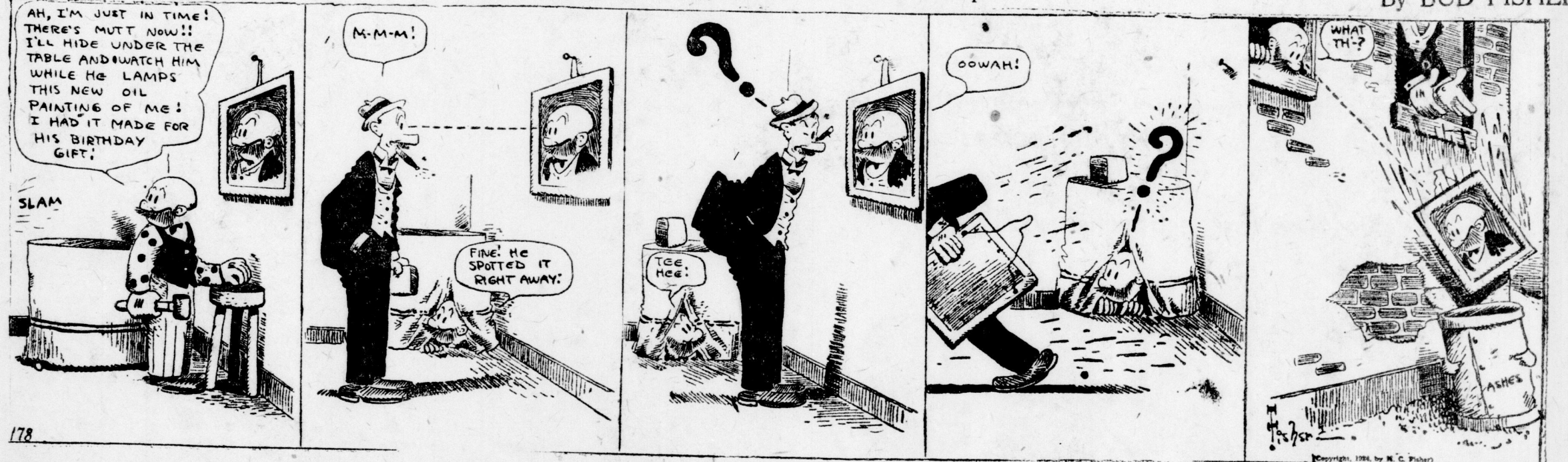
