At a meeting of loggers and millmen held at Vancouver last Thursday, a conference was had with members of the provincial government on the proposed reserve to be granted by the government to the Western Canada Pulp and Paper Company.

The chairman, A. H. Heaps, explained that the meeting was called because it had been reported that a very large grant of timber land had been granted to a pulp company, and had been obtained under what appeared to be false pretences.
