CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

Any person who is the sole head of a ramily, or any mail over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the control of the day of the control of the day of

Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and culivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his fathe mother, son, daughter, brother mother, son, daughter, brother

mother, son, quagner, sister.
In certain districts a homesteader good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead Price \$3.00 per acre, Duties.—Must re side upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent and cultivate fifty acres extra.
