Altogether our meeting was a good one, the attendance being very large and the proceeds (fees and collections)

amounted to \$9.12 cents.

Our Secretary's report of the work of the year is as follows: The Mission Band this year has done very good work. We have held meetings once every month on Sunday morn. ing at ten o'clock, with an average attendance of twenty. We have fifty names on the roll, twelve new names added this year.

At our meetings we have taken up the study of the mis-sionaries, and their work in the different fields, also the

habits and customs of the natives.

Besides this work we have had weekly sewing classes, which were very well attended. At these meetings we made quilts to send away at Christmas time. We have had two social gatherings of the Band, one in January when the mission boxes were brought in and opened, then we had a very interesting programme, after which refreshments were served to the members of the Band. The other meeting was in the form of a picnic or party which we held at Inverlea Park. It was instead of our birthday party, and there were quite a number present, and all brought their birthday offering, and a very epiyable time was spent.

We hope in the coming year we may do as good work, if

not better than the past.

The Treasurer reports as follows: Amount sent to Home Missions, \$17.76; amount sent to Foreign Missions, \$47.32. Baby Band report: Amount sent to Home Missions, \$2.10; amount sent to Foreign Missions, \$2.11. Total amount raised, \$69.29.
