THE following Fishery Regulations have been approved and adopted by Bis Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council, on the 25th instant, under the Statute 29 Vio., cap. 11 (Fisheries Act):-

- "Fishing by means of nets, for the purposes of trade and commerce, except under lesses or licenses from the Department of Crown Lands, is prohibited in the waters of Upper Canada."
- "Except under leases or licenses from the Depart-ment of Crown Lands, salmon shall not be fished for, "caught or killed in nets or other apparatus in Lower "Canada."
- "Within the Counties of Northumberland, Durham, "Peterboro' and Victoria, in Upper Canada, no per-"son shall fish for cathol or kill bass, plokerel (doree), "maskinonge or pike, between the twentieth day of "April and the twentieth day of May."
