

7. The Government of Canada shall pay just and reasonable compensation in settlement of civil claims on the part of any third party arising out of any act or omission of the Canadian Government or any service personnel or civilian employees of the Canadian Government done in the performance of official duties in connection with this Memorandum of Agreement. All such claims shall be expeditiously processed and settled by the authorities of Canada.
8. In relation to civil claims over which the Government of Bahrain has jurisdiction the Government of Canada will endeavour to assist third party claims resulting from any act or omission of any service personnel or civilian employee of the Government of Canada causing injury, death, loss or damage other than in performance of official duties in connection with this Memorandum of Agreement and to obtain satisfaction of any judgment rendered in respect of any such claims.
9. The Canadian forces sent to Bahrain under this Memorandum of Agreement, whether military or civilian, may enter Bahrain with military or Canadian Government identification cards, and their orders. Passports and visas will not be required. Military or Canadian Government identification cards shall be produced, when required, to the appropriate authorities of the Government of Bahrain.
10. Military and civilian personnel of the Canadian forces may operate vehicles owned or leased by the Canadian Government with a valid Canadian driving licence and military identification.
