

ARTICLE XI

1. The two parties shall establish a Joint Russian-Canadian Commission on Audio-Visual Relations which is responsible for examining the terms and conditions and the implementation of this Agreement, resolving any difficulties that may arise and recommending the modifications intended to develop co-operation for the common good of both countries.
2. During the term of the present Agreement, a meeting of this Commission shall take place as required, alternating between the Russian Federation and Canada.
3. The Russian part of the Joint Commission shall be headed by a representative of the Committee of the Russian Federation for Cinematography; the Canadian part of the Joint Commission shall be headed by a representative of the Department of Canadian Heritage.


ARTICLE XII


On the entry into force of the present agreement, the agreement between the Government of Canada and the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics concerning audio-visual relations (with its Protocol) signed in Moscow on November 20, 1989, shall cease to have force as between Canada and the Russian Federation.

ARTICLE XIII

1. The present Agreement will enter into force on the day of its signature.
2. It shall remain in force for a period of three (3) years. A tacit renewal of the Agreement for like periods shall take place unless one or the other party gives written notice of termination six (6) months before the expiry date.
