The Bill No. 160, An Act to amend the Criminal Code, was read the third time and passed.

The Bill No. 153, An Act to amend The Canada Grain Act, was again considered in Committee of the Whole, reported with amendments, considered as amended; By leave of the House, the said Bill was read the third time and passed.

The Bill No. 165, An Act to consolidate and amend the Acts respecting the Ottawa Improvement Commission, was read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, reported without amendment, read the third time and passed.

The Bill No. 152, An Act to encourage the Construction and Improvement of Highways, was read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, reported with amendments, considered as amended;

By leave of the House, the said Bill was read the third time, and passed.

The Bill No. 177, An Act to amend the Judges Act, was read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, reported with an amendment, considered as amended:

By leave of the House, the said Bill was read the third time and passed.

The House went again into Committee of the Whole to consider a proposed Resolution respecting the Purchasing of Departmental and other Supplies and Materials for His Majesty.

And the House continuing in Committee;

And further progress having been made and reported, the Committee obtained leave to consider it again at the next sitting of the House.

A Message was received from the Senate informing this House that the Senate doth concur in the Message of the House of Commons of the 27th June, ultimo, and also to the amendments made by the House of Commons to the Bill "A," intituled: "An Act to consolidate and amend the Railway Act," without any amendment.

The House then adjourned at 12.35 o'clock, a.m.
