In view of the fact that the question deals with air pollution and noxious gases which are spread through the air, sometimes causing death by asphyxiation, would the Prime Minister not say whether an investigation could be carried out through the Department of Energy, Mines and Resources?

FISHERIES

PURCHASE OF SALT COD FOR SHIPMENT TO BIAFRA

On the orders of the day:

Mr. John Lundrigan (Gander-Twillingate): Mr. Speaker, I should like to take the Prime Minister off the hook. He seems to be getting tired. We are getting a little tired as well. Is the Minister of Fisheries prepared to respond

to the question which was taken as notice yesterday by his parliamentary secretary, as to whether the purchase of five million pounds of fish from the Atlantic region will result in an increased price to Atlantic fishermen?

Hon. Jack Davis (Minister of Fisheries): Mr. Speaker, the federal government has taken and is now taking out of the hands of these fishermen about 20 per cent of one year's production. That is a sizeable quantity of fish. Current purchases are at market prices. I do not know what will happen to the market price in the immediate future, but I hope the government's action will have the effect of firming up the price generally and on a world wide basis.

Mr. Lundrigan: Mr. Speaker, is this fish being purchased by the Canadian government for transport to Biafra, or by the Atlantic trade?

Mr. Davis: The fish is being purchased by the Canadian government through various agencies in Newfoundland; for instance, the Newfoundland Associated Fish Exporters Limited, the Canadian Atlantic Salt Fish Exporters Association, and numerous other groups and individual firms in the trade.

DOMINION-PROVINCIAL RELATIONS
