COMPOSITION OF STANDING JOINT COMMITTEE

Mr. John Evans (Parliamentary Secretary to President of the Privy Council): Mr. Speaker, I have a motion that refers to the composition of the Standing Joint Committee on Official Languages, Policy and Programs. We have had discussions with the other Parties about this. I move:

That the quorum of the Standing Joint Committee of the Senate and of the House of Commons on Official Languages, Policy and Programs, be six Members, whenever a vote, resolution or other decision is taken, so long as both Houses, the Government and the Opposition are represented, and that the joint Chairmen be authorized to hold meetings, to receive evidence and authorize the printing thereof, when four Members are present so long as both Houses, the Government and the Opposition are represented; and

That a message be sent to the Senate requesting that the House do unite with this House for the above purpose.

Mr. Hnatyshyn: Mr. Speaker, there have been the consultations indicated. This motion is necessary in order to establish a quorum under the circumstances. I simply rise to indicate that we are prepared to consent to the motion being put and the passage thereof.

Mr. Speaker: Is there unanimous agreement for the Parliamentary Secretary to introduce this motion?

Some Hon. Members: Agreed.

Mr. Speaker: Is it the wish of the House to adopt the motion?

Some Hon. Members: Agreed.
