Reporting against bill

81. When a committee to which a bill has been referred considers that the bill should not be proceeded with further in the Senate, it shall so report to the Senate, stating its reasons. If the motion for the adoption of the report is carried, the bill shall not reappear on the Order Paper.

Signing of amended bill 82. The chairman of the committee shall sign or initial a printed copy of the bill on which the amendments are clearly written, and shall also sign or initial the several amendments made and clauses added in committee, which shall be attached to the report. Another copy of the bill, with the amendments written thereon, shall be prepared by the clerk of the committee and filed.

Payment of witnesses

83. The Clerk of the Senate is authorized to pay every witness invited or summoned to attend before a select committee a reasonable sum for his living and travelling expenses, upon the certificate of the clerk of the committee attesting to the fact that the witness attended before the committee by invitation or summons.

Budget

83A. (1) A committee that has been empowered by the Senate to incur special expenses in respect of any matter referred to it by the Senate, shall not incur any such special expenses until the chairman of that committee, or a senator acting for him, has presented to the Committee on Internal Economy, Budgets and Administration a budget setting forth in reasonable detail estimates of its proposed expenditures for a specific period of time, and until the said budget has been approved in whole or in part by the latter committee.

Supplementary budget (2) When the expenditures of any such committee have reached the limits set forth in any such budget, the committee shall not incur any further special expenses until a supplementary budget or supplementary budgets has or have been presented by or on behalf of its chairman to the Committee on Internal Economy, Budgets and Administration and approved in whole or in part by the latter committee.
