

MR. WILLIAM ODELL, of Odell in Bedfordshire, England, name appears there in the probate of John, daughter Rebecca of obtaining further evidence of Odell, Odell, and Odell. The in the parish registers of Theoford, Odell, alias Odell, of Mollington, the progenitor of the Woodhulls in 1668.



HEZEKIAH ODELL, of Stratfield; in 1709, named in Stratfield Church Records as son of John Odell, and renewed the Covenant; in 1735, with brother John, joined in deed to Timothy Wheeler; in 1737, appointed guardian of minor son and daughter; in 1746, commissioned as Lieutenant at Stratfield by the General Assembly. (Fairfield Probate Records.)

DEBORAH, dau. Thomas Bayley, of Fairfield; she d. 27 June, 1756, aged 54; bur. in old church yard at Stratfield and described in epitaph as wife to Lieut.
