U. S. IS INCLUDED

Former British Ambassador Discussed Panama Tolls Question at Washington.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 23.-American diplomats who negotiated the Hay-Pauncefote Treaty had no thought of exempting the United States when they agreed to the provision stipulating that "all nations" should use the Panama Canal on equal terms, according to Henry White, former ambassador to Great Britain. Mr. White was secretary of the embassy at London in 1898, and in the absence of Ambassador Hay opened the perceitions for the many opened the perceit of opened the negotiations for the repeal of the Clayton-Bulwer Treaty, which the Hay-Pauncefote pact supplanted. In an address on diplomacy before the George Washington University students today, he declared that there could be no doubt that the words "all nations" were intended to include the United

"Nobody," said the former ambassa dor, "not in touch with diplomatic affairs could realize what a deplorable thing it was to know that this country was going back on its word. There never could be any doubt that the words 'all nations' included the United States. No one views with deeper humiliation the fact that we have no merchant marine.
