Neither am I, Festus, besides myself; but speak thus freely before the King, because he knows these Things to be Fact; yea, I am fully persuaded the King knows them all to be Fact; for they were not done in a Corner. King Agrippa, believest thou the Prophets? I know thou believest. And would to God that not only thou, but also all that hear me this Day, were altogether such as I am, except these Bonds.
