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MUST HAVE FIFTY COWS TO RANK AS A CREAMERY

Bill to Prohibit Manufacture of Process Butter Discussed in the House.

Ottawa, June 25.—(Special).—Mr. Fisher's bill prohibiting the manufacture of process butter was taken up in committee of the House today.

The clause enacting that only butter manufactured from the cream of fifty cows or more should be marketed "creamery" led to a long discussion.

Messrs. Pope, Gillmor and Henderson thought fifty was too large a number. They pointed out that the great difficulty in establishing a creamery is to get enough farmers interested.

Mr. Henderson moved that the clause should be amended to read 25 cows instead of 50.

Dr. Sproule said that the price of dairy butter is at least two or three cents below creamery butter.

Mr. Fisher admitted that some dairy butter is just as good as creamery butter, but there is an expert standard of creamery butter.

Mr. Fisher repeated that the demand for some such legislation was found in the act, but a dairy producer in England is not a dairy producer in Canada.

Mr. Fisher asked if the bill would increase the cost of butter to the consumer. He said it would not.
