





OTTAWA, April 12 .-(By Canadian Press.)— Dominion lands still undisposed by the Government cover an acreage of 1,080,-750,000 acres. SCHOOL LANDS FOR SOLDIER SETTLERS

OTTAWA, April 12.-The soldier settlement board of Canada has completed arrangements with the three prairie provinces by which considerable areas of school lands in the West have become available for settlement

have become available for settlement by returned soldiers.

It is now possible for a qualified returned soldier to apply for any parcel of school lands within fifteen miles of a railway line. When such parcel is applied for it will be appraised by representatives of the soldier settlement board and the Provincial Government. If there is only one applicant for the specified parcel it is possible for the returned soldier to enter into possession at once. If there are more than one applicant, the parcel will be disposed of by ballot, as in the case of Indian reserves and other lands recently opened for soldier settlement.


PRISONERS OF WAR




