He wrote his first poem at the age of eight, and in response to his grandfather's jocular discouragement, replied earnestly: "The world will some day read the product of my pen." At 22, after graduating from Cambridge, he went to the Pyrenees to help a band of insurgents fight in a lost cause, and returned home to face poverty, his father dying soon afterwards, and the young poet's limited wealth being lost in an unsuccessful wood-turning in-

in an unsuccessful wood-turning industry. He lived in a garret and wrote, "In Memoriam."

Was an inspiration.

His poetic story of Ulysses inspired Peel, discouraged by repeated failure to try again, successfully, in repealing the obnoxious and oppressive corn laws. Then, at Peel's suggestion. Tennyson was given £5,000 as a gift from the nation, and all England read his poems. In an age when Huxley, Darwin, Tyndal and other great scientists were leaving God out of their writings, Tennyson stood four-square against wrong thinking and led the world back to God. The secret of his greatness was his communion with God. Mr. Stanley closed his address by an impressive reading of "Crossing the Bar."
