Amid the dreariness of desolation which has so long reigned in that green, though unhappy and ill-fated Isle, the Lord has graciously poured out his Holy Spirit, and refreshed and comforted his heritage. Revivals, such as were witnessed in the palmy days of Methodism, have been enjoyed on several of the stations in Ireland. Large numbers both of the Protestant and Roman Catholic population have been—

"Gathered into Christ's fold, With his people enrolled, With his people to live and to die."

May that good work never cease !
