HOLDS UP FEES OF ASSESSORS

County Secretary Kelley's Decision Leads to Conference Over Payment

Municipality Finance Committee Deals With Lancaster and Court House Work

Recommendations to increase the credit of the Lancaster Highway Board for work now underway in the vicinity of Lancaster by \$96,480 while awaiting credit payments due from the Provincial Government, and the issuing of bonds to the amount of \$98,000 to cover the full payment due as a result of the restoration of the old court house, were among matters dealt with by the finance committee of the Municipality Council which met in the county secretary's office yesterday afternoon.

Warden R. W. Wigmore presided in the absence of Councillor F. L. Fots. Those present beside the county secretary, J. King Kelley, were Councillors John J. O'Brien, Murray Campbell and William Golding, Lancaster; R. E. McLeod, St. Martins; Edgar Smith, Simonds; James O'Donnell, Musquash; and J. H. Frink and W. L. Harding, from the City Council.

RECOMMENDATION. A recommendation from the building committee that the original appropriation of \$88,000, to cover the cost of restoring the court house, be increased to \$98,000, was adopted. On motion of Councillor Frink, seconded by Councillor Harding, bonds will be issued to cover the indebtedness—\$44,000 to be issued in 20-year bonds at 4 per cent and \$44,000 in serial bonds to be paid off by annual assessment.

A bill aggregating nearly \$8,000 due to the county assessors for the last assessment made up as follows: Lancaster, \$3,968; St. Martins, \$368; Simonds, \$1,064.81 and Musquash \$146, was submitted but as the county secretary refused to lend his assent to their approval, the matter was placed on the table until the warden and county secretary met to discuss the matter at a meeting to be arranged later.

Several certified bills were passed, after which the committee adjourned.

286 ARE REGISTERED AT MOUNT ALLISON. More Students at University Than at This Time Last Year.

SACKVILLE, Oct. 2.—The registration at Mount Allison University is practically complete and the attendance shows an advance over last year. In the faculties of arts, science and theology there is a registration of 204 regular students and 42 taking special courses. In engineering there are 40 regular students. This makes a total registration of 286, as compared with 262 at this time last year. This does not include several students taking extra-mural courses. One hundred and fifty-one of the men are living in the university residence and 87 girls in Allison Hall.

PATENAUDE SCORES "BLUE RUIN" CHARGE

Declares King Administration is Government of Exoduses.

MONTREAL, Oct. 2.—Calling the present administration a "government of exodus," Hon. E. L. Patenaude, provincial Conservative leader, this evening continued his campaign in this province with a speech at Longueuil in the interests of J. Arthur Garneau, who was nominated as Conservative candidate for Chambly-Vercheres.

He denounced the racial prejudices that, he claimed, were being raised by his opponents only to win power, and justified his stand as an independent. He asked that the electorate discuss the present affairs of the country "so that none will be led away by blind prejudices and deceiving lies."
