### JOINS DIRECTORATE OF McCONNELL & FERGUSON, LIMITED



Major W. J. Baxter, who was born and educated in Windsor, left the city editorship of the old Windsor Record in the fall of 1914 to take a commission as lieutenant in the 18th Battalion, com-  
manded by Lieut.-Col. B. S. Wigle.  
He was mentioned in despatches, Jan. 1, 1917, by the then Sir Douglas Haig for his memorable services as battalion scout officer at St. Eloi in 1916 and as adjutant in the Somme battle in Sep-  
tember of the same year. In the Can-  
adial advance on Oct. 11, 1918, he further distinguished himself and was badly wounded. For the gallantry displayed on this occasion he was awarded the Military Cross.

On demobilization, Major Baxter be-  
came secretary of the Essex Border  
Utilities Commission, a position which  
he resigned in March, 1920, to take con-  
trol of the advertising department of the  
Ford Motor Company of Canada, com-  
mited. Under his superintendence the ad-  
vertising of the company has acquired
