

BENJAMIN ADOPTS Wilkesbarre, Pa., Dec. 17—Park Benjamin, 70 years old, wealthy lawyer and father-in-law of Enrico Caruso, famous tenor, came here Tuesday with Miss Anna M. Blochi, whose age is given as "more than 21," a former governess of the present Mrs. Caruso, and left the following day legally as father and daughter. Judge John M. Garman, of the Luzerne courts, granted a decree in adoption early Wednesday.

Attorney W. Alfred Valentine, of this city, appeared with Benjamin and Miss Belehy in court. He presented the affidavits and petitions and then cited several supreme court decisions to show that a decree in adoption may be granted to "temporary, residents or sojourners." Soon as the jurisdiction of the court was established Judge Garman banded down the decree.

W. Alfred Valentine, an attorney here, said today that he was called into the case by Arthur L. Fullman, lawyer, of 302 Broadway, New York. He informed the New York attorney that the law was clear and that the decree could be obtained here.
