

## TELLS THE STORY OF HALIFAX DISASTER

Thrilling Lecture By Mrs. E. A. Smith, Illustrated With Views, in German Street Institute

The tragic story of the great Halifax disaster and the intense suffering that it caused a great percentage of the inhabitants with the loss of their loved ones, their homes, their businesses, and the terrible and painful injuries that they sustained, was the subject upon which Mrs. E. A. Smith addressed a large and sympathetic audience in German Street Institute last evening. After the lecture a large number of views of the stricken city before and after the tragedy were shown and they supplemented the story which the lecturer told.

The lecture was given under the auspices of the Royal Standard Chapter of the I. O. D. E. The Institute was filled, there being more than 300 people present. His Worship Mayor Hayes introduced the speaker, Mrs. Smith, after making a few introductory remarks, during which he outlined the purpose of the lecture, namely that of arousing the sympathy of the people of the city in the sufferers in the explosion and particularly in those who have been deprived of their sight.

The story of the disaster was followed by a large number of views. These showed the city both before and after the explosion, and they bore out in every respect the words of the speaker regarding the devastation which preceded and still prevails in the stricken city. Some of these views were found in a camera beside the body of a man who was killed while taking them.

During the evening some were given by Mrs. Crockett, and were enjoyed greatly. After the views had been shown, Mrs. Smith made an appeal for the blind of the Maritime Provinces who are educated at the Maritime School for the Blind in Halifax.

John Weir, who is the assistant of Sir Frederick Fraser, the superintendent in the above institution, addressed the meeting on the subject of helping in the education of the blind of the Maritime provinces. He spoke along the same lines as he did in the Imperial Theatre a short time ago. He described what the institution does to fit the blind to take up some line of occupation and he told of the position in which the school is financially. To carry on this great work, funds are needed and it is upon donations that the school looks for support. Cards and a circular letter from Sir Frederick Fraser were distributed throughout the room.

A vote of thanks to the speaker was moved by Rev. Dr. Jenner of Charlotte street Baptist church, West St. John, and was seconded by the applause of the whole audience.

## FOUR SONS IN KHAKI

Gordon, who has been on the firing line nearly three years, has received the military medal for locating a German machine gun section under heavy fire at Vimy Ridge. He was wounded there and is now in England. His medal has been sent to his
