

A special Prize for the encouragement of French has been given for some years by the Council of Public Instruction in Quebec.

The "Old Boys" Prize was founded 1874, by former Lennoxville boys, as an evidence of regard and affection for their old school.

The "Irving" Prize was founded in memory of the late Rev. G. C. Irving, Rector of the School 1863-7, for the best boy in Mathematics in the Lower School.

The Robertson Prize for the best collection of Wild Flowers is given by the Rev. A. H. Robertson, of Cookshire, P.Q.

A prize is given yearly to the boy, who, in the opinion of the Head Master and Masters, has been, by his good conduct and loyalty, of the greatest service to the School.

Of those Lennoxville boys who have entered the Royal Military College nearly all have been offered commissions in the Imperial and Dominion Forces.
