During the last three months of the year, one hundred and four yards of unmade material, several warm garments and four pairs of boots were given to the poor and needy. In November, twenty-eight flannel garments were sent to the Hervey Institute. In December, eighteen pinafores to Children's ward in General Hospital, also seven nightengales to Ladies' Benevolent. The above garments were the work of the members, who meet on Tuesday afternoons at half-past two.

Thanks are due those ladies who undertook the arduous duty of collecting.
