on First Charge.

First Witness: L-12128 Sgt. Lawrence, G.C. - S.S. <sup>CASF</sup> ~~h~~  
for Prosecution being duly called and sworn, is examined by  
Prosecutor and states:-

I was Co. Orderly Sgt. on March 4<sup>th</sup> 1940.  
I called Defaulters at 1800 hrs. The accused  
answered the call. He done his pack drill  
from 1800 to 1900 hrs. I dismissed him  
and other defaulters at 1900 hrs. I again  
called Defaulter Parade at 2000 hrs. The  
accused was missing. I reported to his  
Co. Orderly Sgt. and then to the R.S.M.  
They sent two G.M.P.'s out to look for  
him and they reported back that they  
couldn't find him.

The accused was confined to barracks  
at the time he went absent as above  
stated.
