THE VENETTA.

A BATTLE, A COURT MARTIAL AND AN EXECUTION.

The McCoy's surprise a Hatfield and McCoy vendetta has reached here.

About thirty of the McCoy's surprised a Hatfield camp near Green Brook, last Thursday night and poured a volley into their enemies, killing John Hatfield, one of the leaders, and Edwin Brown, son of the woman who was killed at Fuley's Creek.
