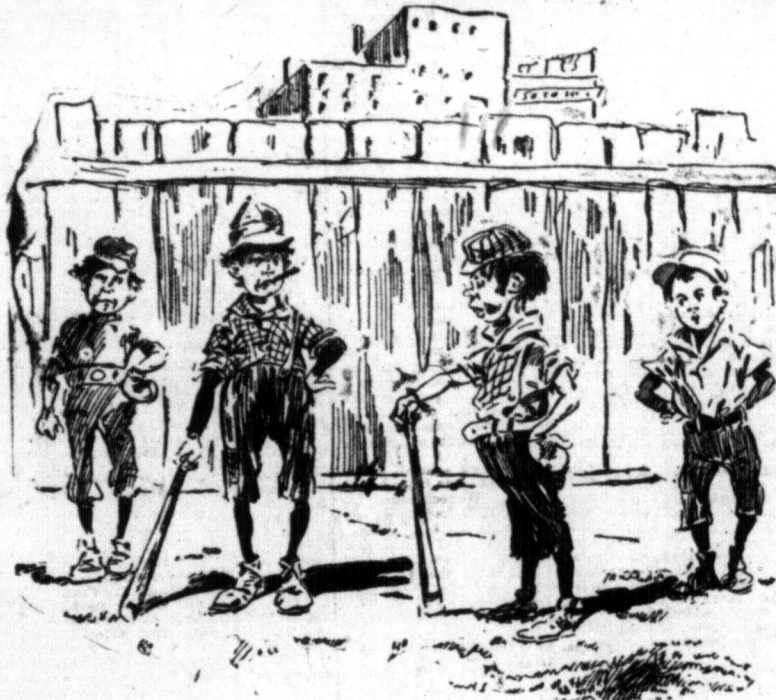
GENERAL SPORTS.

What is Going on in Baseball and Other Athletic Games.

News, Local and Telegraphic, Gathered From Reliable Sources.

The official score published herewith really does not do justice to the local league baseball game between the Taylor Co.'s nine and The Planes aggregation, played on the Athletic grounds yesterday afternoon. Brackin stood at the pitching box trying with the ball, a radiant smile mantling his classic front. Sowerby snatched around the key-stone mark as though he had just received glad news from home. Miller romped and gawgled around his shady posture like a frisky lamb. Anderson loomed against the grandstand contentedly smoking and every player betokened a sublime and delightful confidence.

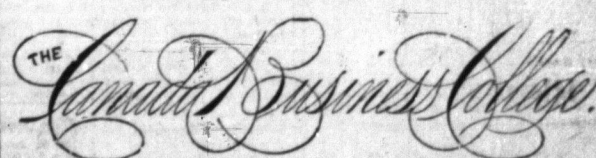
