London banks have received an official warning that a counterfeit of Bank of England notes is being circulated. It is so well made that already several and officials have been deserved. The paper is of exactly the same texture as that used by the Bank of England, and the engraving is perfect, but the water-mark is defective. Detectives believe that the forgers are working on a big scale, and that their factory is on the Continent.

The discovery of the fraud was made at the Bank of England itself. A fifty pound note was detected as a forger lifter it had passed unquestioned through several hands.
