**LAWYER PATRICK ASKS CLEMENCY**

The final appeal to the governor was signed by Patrick in the death house. It is not believed that the document has been presented to Gov. Higgins yet.

John T. Milliken, brother-in-law of Patrick, who has spent a fortune to save his wife's brother from a felon's death, is the one who insisted that Patrick should ask clemency. It is believed that the governor insisted on a personal letter of appeal from Patrick.

**KOEPENIK ROBBED; PEOPLE LAUGHING**

Queer Performance of Hero of Koepenik and His Darling Raid—Supportless to Bed

**GENEVA, Dec. 17.**—People have not yet done laughing over the queer performance of the hero of Koepenik and his daring raid at the head of the regulars on the treasure chest of the mayor, but a story now being circulated here shows that the moral pointed by it may have rather disagreeable results. At the present time a battalion of Swiss reservists is going through a course of training in the neighborhood of Bale, and a few days ago it started on a long march which necessitated it being put up for the night at one or two villages on the way. One morning an officer was sent on by the commander to secure quarters and on his arrival at the place indicated that he would be there at six o'clock that evening and requested the mayor to provide suitable lodgings as well as sufficient rations for the men. The mayor eyed his visitor for awhile and then he exclaimed that he was not such a greenhorn as the officer seemed to imagine. Much surprised the latter inquired what the mayor meant by this extraordinary remark and was told to use his talent for practical joking elsewhere as it would not go down in that particular village. In vain did the officer try argument, persuasion and as a last resource threats. "Look here," replied the mayor, "we are not at Koepenik. I have no inclination to be made the laughing stock of the whole of Europe and if you do not clear out immediately I shall have you arrested."

That evening promptly at the hour mentioned the battalion marched into the town to find that not the slightest preparations had been made to receive them. The men had to be lodged the best way they could and many of them went surprised to bed.
