LAWYER PATRICK ASKS CLEMENCY

The final appeal to the governor was signed by Patrick in the death house. It is not believed that the document has been presented to Gov. Higgins yet. John T. Milliken, brother-in-law of Patrick, who has spent a fortune to save his wife's brother from a felon's death, is the one who insisted that Patrick should ask clemency. It is reported that the governor insisted on a personal letter of appeal from Patrick.

MAY INTERGATE WRECK OF STEAMER

Canadian Government Asked to Look into Case of English Sailors Who Were Frozen. DETROIT, Mich., Dec. 17.—A despatch from Sault Ste Marie, Mich., says:—The Sons of England, through President J. Bates have asked the Canadian Government for an investigation of the wreck of the steamer Golpe and the consequent exposure of her English sailors who were so badly frozen that five had to have their feet amputated and one his hands as well. The sailors say they wandered three nights on a cheerless shore of Lake Superior. They found the officers on the boat in warm quarters but claim they were refused admittance or even permission to warm themselves. After sleeping in the snow the third night when they were frozen, they were found by Indians who rescued them. The men are in the Canadian Sea Hospital, and one may not recover. The names of the sailors are: Arthur Green, of London, Eng.; J. H. Keeling, of Rutherford, Yorkshire, Eng.; John Donnelly, of Belfast, Ireland; and James Thornburn, and William Macdonald, of Glasgow.
