# OF THE BRITISH NAVY

Important Rearrangement of Divisions —Projected Railroad From India to China—Newcastle Sheriff Resigns

LONDON, Jan. 5.—An interesting proposal for the construction of a railway between India and China is advanced by Mr. Noel Williamson. Mr. Williamson is a political officer in the service of the Indian government, who while stationed in Upper Assam, has found an opportunity for exploring the Lohit branch of the Brahmaputra up to the Tibetan frontier. He found no serious natural difficulties in the way of his progress up the Lohit Valley, and believes it would be an easy matter, as a beginning, to connect India with the borders of Southeastern Tibet by a good mule track. The distance from the plains of Assam to the border of Tibet is less than fifty miles in a straight line and little more than a hundred miles by the river valley.
