Worth of Fair is Being Recognized as Days Go By—Judges Make Good Progress and Many Exhibits are Decorated With Prize Ribbons—Poultry Show a Feature.

Game fowl are not very strongly shown, the tendency being to the more practical classes. In bantams there are black, red and brown red, black Sumatra, Pyle, Duckwing Mid Laced and other varieties, while the prettiest class in the show, and the one which for appearance wins the most compliments from visitors, are the dainty silkies.

Ornamental bantams are represented by Buff and Cochins popular divisions. There are also classed white booted and R. C. black and white, as well as golden and silver Seabrights, and some fine bearded Polish bantams.

There is a particularly good showing in the pens of poultry entered for competition. These are shown on the southern side of the poultry house, and contain some splendid birds. In pet stock, rabbits and pigeons, the showing is light. There are some pretty Belgian hares and several specimens of the Canadian rabbit.
