Mr. Schreiner says: Americans are apt to think that the army and navy equipment and the financial resources of the United States are so superior to those of Mexico, that the clash of arms would be of short duration. The truth is, an invasion of Mexi-co might repeat the experience of Great Britain with the Boers in 1899-1902. The territory in which the United States army would op-erate is even more difficult than that which tried the wits of British officers. The Mexicans are as much attached to their soil as were the Boers. While the Boers were able to put only 35,000 men in the field, it is said that Mexico would have no difficulty in placing 200,000 men under arms. Great Britain had in the field at one time 275,000 men, and the cost of the campaign against the ars was more than a bil-lion flars. Mexico might be quite as fard an ut to crack. The notion that a company of Texas rangers could cross the Rio Grande and subdue the entire re-public as fast as their mounts could cover it cannot too quickly be dispelled.
