STMR. LANSLOWNE ARRIVES.

The government steamer Lans-
downe, Capt. Burns, arrived in port
yesterday after a full trip to the Bay
picking up buoys. Capt. Burns reports
that little or no ice was encountered
which is strange for this time of the
year. Buoy was picked up and the
weather was mild.

STMR. PARTHENIA PICKED UP.

The Donaldson Line steamer Par-
thenia, Whitmer master, from Bos-
ton, arrived at St. John, N. B., with
cargo of pulp, was picked up 200 miles
east of St. John's by the Nova Scotia
Steel and Coal Company's boat Vana-
na, with loss of mudder, and is be-
ing towed to St. John's. The Donald-
son liner being towed to St. John's,
N.B., for repairs, is a fine steamer,
being well known in this port.
