Newcastle, Nov. 10—The following was telegraphed to Ottawa last night:

"Newcastle, Nov. 10, 1915.

"To the Honorable Sir Sam Hughes, Minister of Militia, Ottawa:

"The citizens of Newcastle and of the upper section of Northumberland county held a representative meeting here on 9th instant to consider the proposal of raising a batalion under Lieutenant-Colonel Mersereau for overseas service and to be recruited from the four morthern counties of New Brunswick.

"The meeting was representative and enthusiastic and in full accord with the proposal. It was also of the opinion that this batalion could easily be recruited within the bounds of these counties and it unanimously passed a resolution that if Lieut-Col. Mersereau's offer to raise this battalion was accepted the citizens would do all in their power to make the project a success.

"Resolutions were also adopted approving the proposal of the Minister of Militia that recruited men when in sufficient numbers be quartered and drilled in towns in their vicinity during the winter.

"A committee was appointed to respectfully urge upon you the desirability of accepting Lieut-Col. Mersereeau's offer and of communicating to you the resolutions adopted by the meeting.
