**NEW THEATRE BEGUN**  
**IN FREDERICTON**

Ground has been broken for the new theatre in Fredericton which is to be built by Messrs. Fenety. This will be the first theatre on Queen street and it has a fine position, just opposite the new post office.

The structure will be entirely of steel and concrete, and the plans being followed are those of the modern theatres with a deep lobby. There will be an entrance and exit on the main street and the entire building is to be fire-proof. It will have a seating capacity of one thousand.
