Before this work reached its present magnitude it was able, through the generosity of the Dutch public, to carry on without making an appeal to America, but it today its field of endeavor has outstripped its resources and it too, like so many other charities has become largely dependent upon the Belgian Relief Commission which is in turn largely dependent upon the penerosity of the public of this country.

Numerous Belgian orphans were adopted by Dutch families, but the economic situation in Holland has been completely altered of late, a great many adopted children again have been thrown upon the mercy of the charities. In this extremity a system of homes was established throughout Belgium and Holland. It has been extremely successful in this endeavor although again badly handicapped by
