Mrs. Nelson Rand, of Everett, Mass.
The funeral service will take place at
her late home, 65 Harrison Street, at
2:30 on Saturday.

BELGIAN RELIEF WORK
SAVES CHILD LIVES.

What the Red Cross means to a
soldier struck down on the field of
battle, the Belgian Relief means to
day to the children of Belgium, ground
down under the iron heel of a bar-
barous invader. When famine and tuber-
culosis were exacting a terrible toll of
death among the children of the in-
dressed country, many notable victo-
ries were attained over the two deadly
enemies of childhood—malnutrition
and disease. An efficient means of
combating these enemies was found
in the removal of the greatest possible
number of unfortunate little ones to
Holland, where they were given a full
measure of hospitality. Before this
work reached its present magnitude
it was able, through the generosity of
the Dutch public, to carry on without
making an appeal to America, but
today its field of endeavor has out-
stripped its resources and it too, like
so many other charities has become
largely dependent upon the Belgian
Relief Commission which is in turn
largely dependent upon the generosity
of the public of this country.

Numerous Belgian orphans were
adopted by Dutch families, but the
economic situation in Holland has
been completely altered of late, a
great many adopted children again
have been thrown upon the mercy of
the charities. In this extremity a sys-
tem of homes was established through-
out Belgium and Holland. The Belgian
Relief Commission is today appealing
to the people of Canada for financial
support. Contributions should be ad-
dressed to the local branch of the

Committee at 59 St. Peter street,
Montreal, Quebec.
